Project Description

Two letter-forms creation with two types of format which are inking and modeling.

For the small scale letter-form creation:

- Choose a font style which you prefer.
(The font choice need to be unique and stylish, no boldface letter accepted)
- Using any materials to make a 3D model letter.
(Materials can be clay, plastics, paper, gel, wood, glass, etc.)
- Finished letter-form layout need to be stick on a 3"x4" portrait black board.
(Black foam board is required)

For the large scale letter-form creation:

- Choose the same font style as the small scale letter-form.
(The font choice need to be unique and stylish, no boldface letter accepted)
- Using any ink or black color marker, and 18"x24" paper.
(Ink can be any types drawing ink except oil paint. Paper can be watercolor or marker paper.)
- Finished letter-form layout need to be hand-drawn on the paper.
(No black board is required for the large scale letter-form)

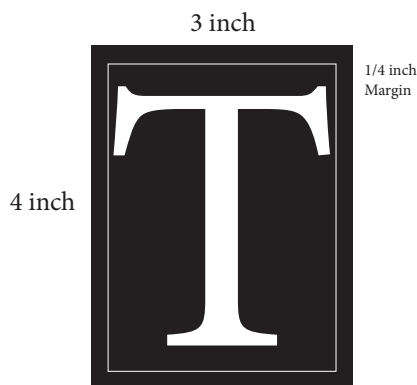
Recommend Materials

Markers or brushes, watercolor paper or marker paper, foam board, knife, ruler, cutting mat, super glue, and etc.

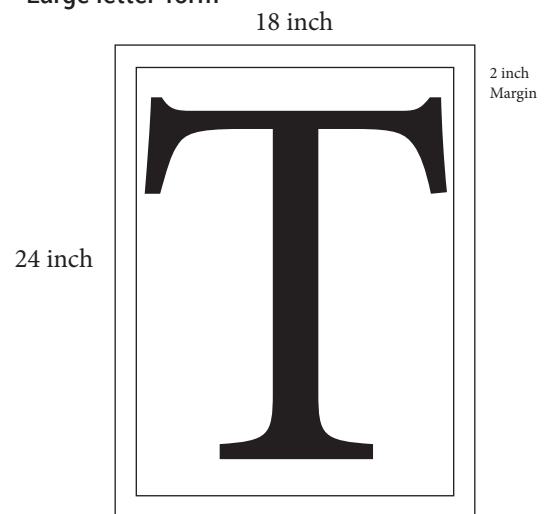
